Gettysburg Address Stamp

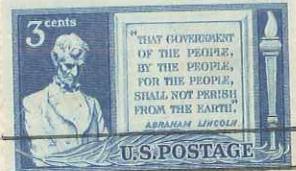
The cornerstone of the Gettysburg National Monument was laid with Masonic ceremonies by the Grand Lodge of Pennsylvania on July 4, 1865. The President of the Soldiers' National Cemetery had requested the Fraternity "to lay in due and ancient Masonic form the foundation stone." The Grand Master, in his address, said: "Let us here, on the birthday of our nation, pay merited honor to the memories of those citizens who have given up their lives in defense of those principles which test true patriotism."

These have a combined area of 135 sq. mi. Formerly known as the Danish West Indies, the group was purchased from Denmark under a treaty ratified June 17, 1917. The price was 25 million dollars. The formal occupation of the islands was on Mar. 31, 1917. The government was administered by the Navy Dept. until 1931, when control was given to the Dept. of the Interior. Full territorial rights, and U.S. citizenship to the natives were granted on Feb. 25, 1937. Chief products of the islands are sugar, molasses and rum.

IOWA TERRITORY CENTENNIAL

THE PRESENT STATE OF IOWA WAS INCLUDED IN THE TERRITORY FORMALLY CLAIMED BY FRANCE IN 1682 BY RIGHT OF EXPLORATION. THE FIRST SETTLEMENT WAS MADE AT DUBUQUE IN 1788. IT BECAME, IN TURN, A POSSESSION OF THE SPANISH AND AGAIN THE FRENCH. IT WAS A PART OF THE LOUISIANA PURCHASE OF 1803. FROM 1804 TO 1838, IT WAS GOVERNED SUCCESSIVELY AS A PART OF INDIAN TERRITORY, LOUISIANA TERRITORY, MISSOURI TERRITORY, AN UNORGANIZED TERRITORY, MICHIGAN TERRITORY AND WISCONSIN TERRITORY. IN 1838 WISCONSIN TERRITORY WAS DIVIDED. THE WESTERN PORTION, UNDER THE NAME "IOWA," WAS ADMITTED TO THE UNION AS A TERRITORY, ON JULY 28th, 1838. THE STAMP AFFIXED HERETO WAS ISSUED TO COMMEMORATE THE 100th ANNIVERSARY OF IOWA'S BECOMING A TERRITORY AND THE 150th ANNIVERSARY OF THE FIRST SETTLEMENT.
