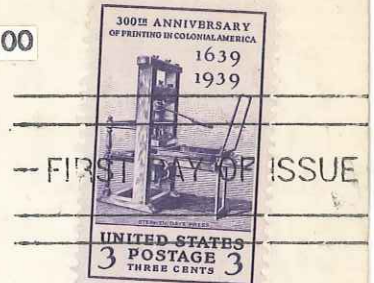

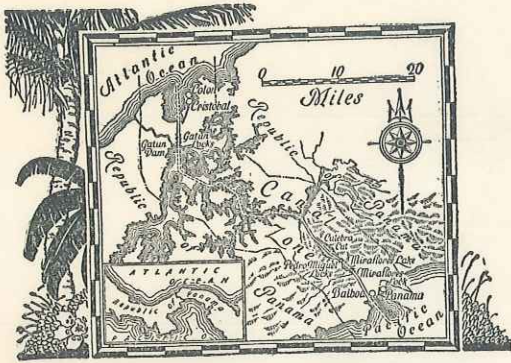

PANAMA CANAL COMMEMORATIVE

THE STAMP APPLIED HERETO WAS ISSUED IN COMMEMORATION OF THE 25th ANNIVERSARY OF THE OPENING OF THE PANAMA CANAL TO THE COMMERCE OF THE WORLD... ENVISIONED FOR AGES ACTUAL WORK ON THE CANAL BEGAN JAN. 1, 1880 UNDER THE SPONSORSHIP OF A FRENCH COMPANY AND THE LEADERSHIP OF DE LESSEPS, BUILDER OF THE SUEZ CANAL... FINANCIAL AND YELLOW FEVER, LED TO THE ABANDONMENT OF THE FRENCH PROJECT IN 1889. AFTER THE EXPENDITURE OF \$200,000,000 AND THE LOSS OF MANY LIVES... FRENCH RIGHTS WERE ACQUIRED BY THE UNITED STATES AND THE PROJECT AUTHORIZED BY CONGRESS IN 1904... BETWEEN THAT DATE AND SEPT. 16, 1915, WHEN THE FIRST VESSEL WAS LOCKED THROUGH THE CANAL, THE WORLD'S GREATEST ENGINEERING AND SANITATION PROJECTS WERE COMPLETED AT A COST OF \$375,000,000... MARINER 10 ☆ VENUS/MERCURY

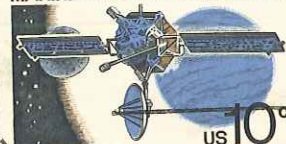
IN 1974 THE SPACECRAFT MARINER 10 TOOK MAN'S FIRST CLOSEUP PICTURES OF THE PLANET VENUS, AND THEN WENT ON TO MERCURY, ALSO TAKING CLOSEUP PICTURES OF THIS TINY PLANET NEAREST THE SUN AT 720 KILOMETERS. NEXT MARINER ORBITED THE SUN AND FLEW BY MERCURY A SECOND TIME. THE WEALTH OF SCIENTIFIC INFORMATION SENT BACK BY MARINER TO DEMONSTRATED THE EFFECTIVENESS OF NASA'S GRAVITY-POWERED SLINGSHOT TECHNIQUE, IN WHICH THE GRAVITY OF VENUS WAS USED TO HURTLE THE SPACECRAFT TOWARD MERCURY.

APOLLO 12 MOON LANDING

November 19th, 1969 - Astronauts Conrad and Bean proved that a manned space craft could be guided to an exact point of landing on the moon by bringing down their lunar module "Intrepid" just 600 feet from the designated target. A few hours later the two Astronauts were walking on the lunar surface becoming the third and fourth man to walk on the moon.

APOLLO 12 LAUNCH TO THE MOON

November 14th, 1969 - Apollo 12 - with Astronauts Conrad, Bean and Gordon - broke through the top of the storm clouds at about 23,000 feet and 11 1/2 minutes after blast off, the three engines of the giant Saturn 5, the most powerful rocket built, put the Apollo 12 in earth orbit some 100 miles high. At 2:09 pm the third stage fired again, sending the Apollo 12 on the way to its planned landing on the eastern shore of the Ocean of Storms.

November 19th, 1969 - Astronauts Conrad and Bean proved that a manned space craft could be guided to an exact point of landing on the moon by bringing down their lunar module "Intrepid" just 600 feet from the designated target. 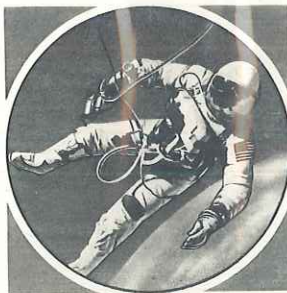

APOLLO 12 SPLASHDOWN

November 24th, 1969 - Blasting off the moon - Astronauts Conrad and Bean took with them 90 pounds of moon rocks and the T.V. from the Surveyor 3 satellite. After meeting and docking with the command module "Yankee Clipper" the three US Astronauts were on their way home and with the same accuracy as when it started they ended the 10 day flight in the Pacific Ocean just 3.1 miles from the recovery ship the U.S.S. Hornet.
