On arrival letter franked with strip of three 2pi postage due stamp (3pi for postage and 3pi for due) tied by MONASTIR*TURQUIE 5 May (A&P type 6) date stamps.

OTTOMAN EMPIRE U.P.U. Issues, 1876 – 1891



Following Ottoman Empire's entry into 'General Postal Organization' which later in 1878 called Universal Postal Union at 1st of April 1875, so called 'Empire' stamps issued for use to countries belonging to the U.P.U. The postage and postage-due stamps used in this period are the same in design.

The Printing & Paper

All of the stamps of this issue were printed in typography by *Dette Publique Ottomane* in Istanbul. Designer is unknown. They were to be used to U.P.U Countries only till March 1884. From that day on were available to use in the Empire as well. The paper of the prints is white, generally good quality with varying thickness and printed in sheets of 150 (10 x 15)

The Perforation

Except the July 1884 issue which is printed 11 ½ perforation, all stamps officially printed with 13 ¼ perforation. However most of them also available in perforation 11 ½ suggesting they were produced to meet demands from dealers and collectors.

This Exhibit

It gives an impression of the stamps issued during this period including , locally surcharged issues, handstamped printed matter types and with emphasis on errors and varieties as well as largest known pieces. Although this collection is not a postal history one, the rates are explained as much as possible and the emphasis is not cancels but the use of stamps on document where available. Exhibit also shows some unique proofs and essays as well as a section for forgeries.

Printing Process

Stamps printed by typography at five stages. First a light coloured background surface printed from typographic plates followed by framed design and denominations. The printing plates consisted of 15 horizontal rows of 10 dies. Therefore each sheet contains 150 stamps. Original dies prepared for the first issue of 1876 used until 1881. Then in the 1881 issue, the die of 5 paras is obtained from the original die of 5 piastres by replacing *PIASTRES* with *PARAS* and the original die of 1 piastres was corrected by removing the last letter of *S* from *PIASTRES*. These corrected dies are used until 1890. It is not known when these stamps withdrawn from circulation.



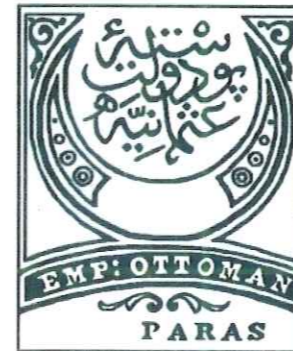
It has been mirror printed with the words **Posta-i Devleti Osmaniye [Ottoman Government Post]** written in five lines on each side. Below the arch **Sene-i 1291 [Year 1875]** which is the year of Ottoman Empire's entry into General Postal Organization, later in 1878 called Universal Postal Union.

Total franking of 3pi 10pa assumingly was the rate for bundle of newspapers.

Only known document of bisected 10 on 20pa IMPRIME hand stamp.

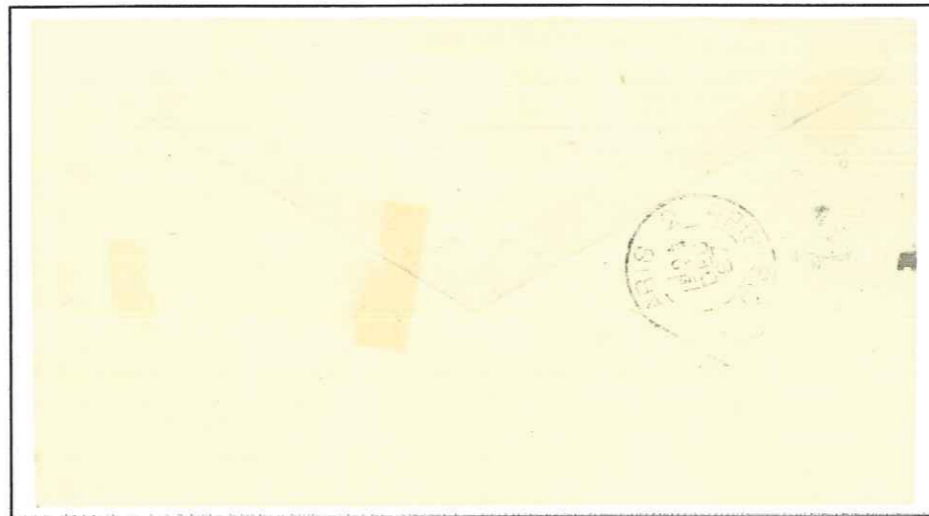

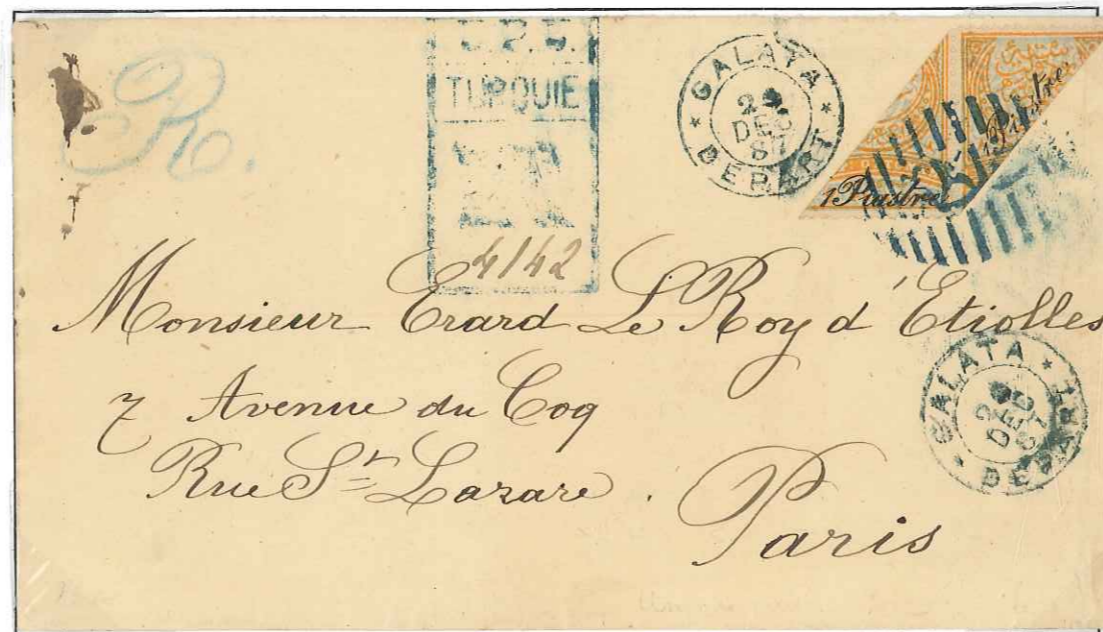

Istanbul City Post

Between 1870 and 1873 all internal mail to Istanbul was subject to a local delivery charge. For that purpose earlier star & crescent stamps handstamped with LOCAL cachet in various forms used. This practice reinstated on 1880 for about a year and regular stamps used for the purpose. So far all recorded examples bearing the 1876 and 1880 issues. All covers recoded from this period are scarce

1880 (April) registered double weight cover to Istanbul franked with 1pi and 5pi of Duloz type stamps and tied by YOZGAT (A&P type 1, rated RR) hand stamp. On arrival 1pi of 1880 issue affixed for Local Delivery and tied by oval Baghce Capussi date stamp.



1880 (28 March) registered cover to Istanbul franked on reverse with 1pi and 2pi of Duloz type stamps and tied by ANDRINOPLE * TURQUIE (A&P type 12, rated R) date stamp. On arrival 1pi of 1880 issue stamp affixed for Local Delivery and tied by oval Baghtce Capussi date stamp alongside Stamboul 31 March cds.



1880 (August) cover with its contents to Istanbul franked with 1pi of Duloz type stamp and tied by double circle MANASTIR 81 (A&P type 4) [today Bitola, Macedonia] hand stamp. On arrival pair of 1876 20pa stamps affixed and tied by Baghtce Capussi oval date stamp.

Pre-hand stamped ŞEHİR – LOCAL (City) Postal Stationeries.

Out of six different hand stamps used on star & crescent stamps only three types applied on 20 paras Postal Stationery Cards to be used in Istanbul. They are only applied on postal stationery cards. Genuinely used examples are very scarce



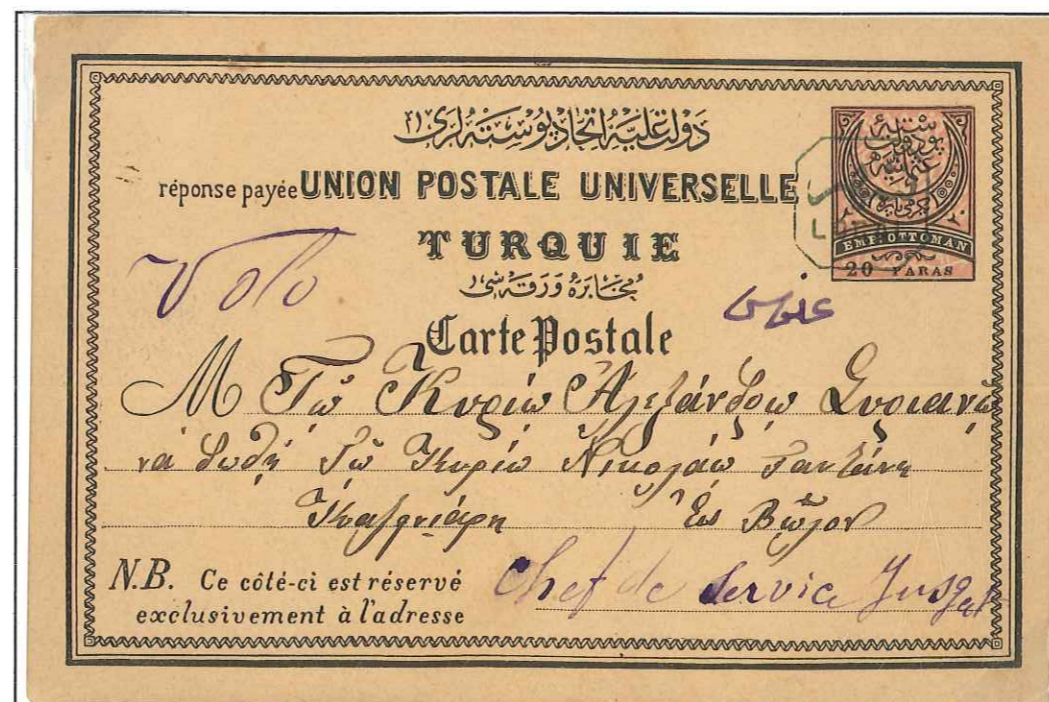

1890 – 1892 BIASECTED STAMPS SURCHARGED AT BAGHDAD

Due to shortage of certain values, by the authorization of Central Post Office various stamps surcharged and bisected in Baghdad for local use only. Three types of hand stamps prepared and used between 1890 to 1892.

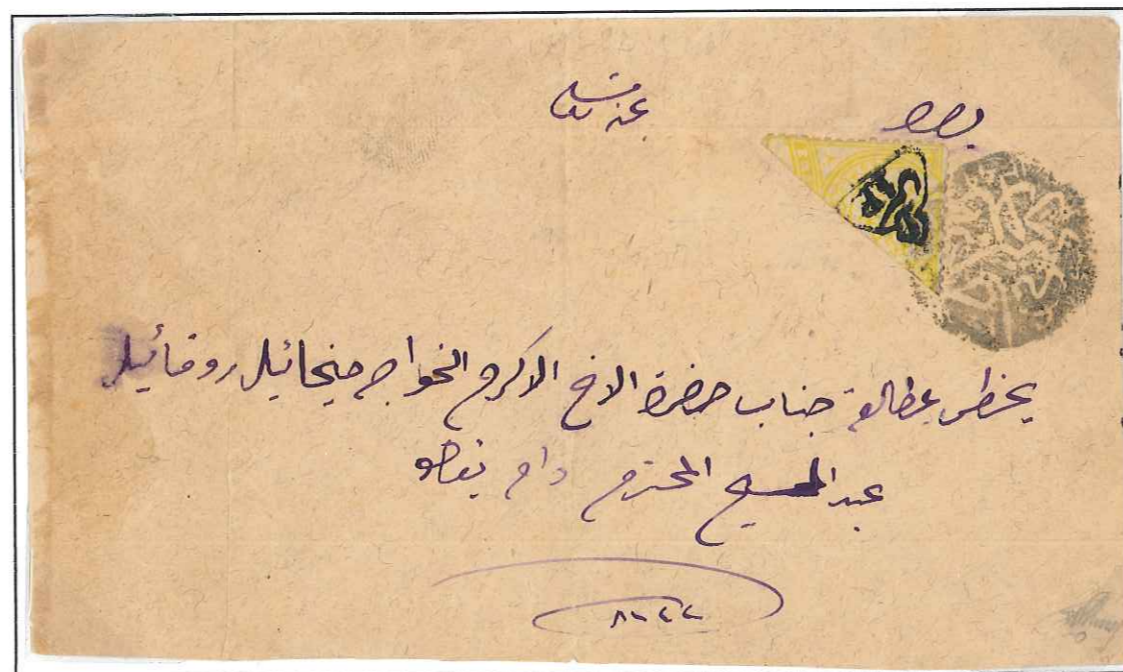

Mixed Issue Covers

Ottoman Empire entered to U.P.U on 1st of April 1875 and to comply with regulations so called Duloz type 1876 (13 January) star and crescent stamps surcharged with western numbers and letters and used until the new type of stamps issued on 27th September 1876. *Usage of two different issues together rarely seen on documents.* All recorded examples dated 1880 and also bearing ¼ Pre surcharged Duloz stamps, suggesting that they have been reused because of the shortage for 10pa value since the basic rate for letters to UPU countries was 1pi10pa (or 50paras) on that time.



1880 (25 August) cover to Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada franked with 1pi and Duloz type ¼ Pre on 10pa tied by Constantinople dispatch date stamps. Reverse London transit and Halifax (SP 12) arrival cds's.



1880 (7 September) cover to U.S.A. franked with 1pi and Duloz type ¼ Pre on 10pa tied by Alexandrette date stamps. Reverse Alexandrie (12 SE), London (SP 20) and New York (OCT 1) transit and Wellsville (OCT 2) arrival cds's.

1888 (12 November) cover to Russia franked with 1pi of 13 May 1884 issue and tied by MONT – ATHOS (A&P type 5, rated **RRR**) date stamp. Reverse 5 k. Bogorodsk Zemstvo stamp affixed on arrival and tied 15.11 arrival cds.



1880 (24 September) Queen Victoria 1d postal card to Germany tied by red British Post Office * Constantinople cds. Card posted by Ottoman post therefore 20pa of 1876 issue affixed and tied by Constantinople*Turquie cds. Pre-valued stationeries of the foreign offices in Ottoman Empire can not be used through Ottoman post.



1884 (13 July) cover from Putney, London, England to Izmir franked with 2½d plate 22 Queen Victoria stamp and tied by dispatch cds. Reverse 21 July arrival cds. Cover re-directed to Ghediz (approx. 250km east of Izmir) on 26th of July then returned to sender via Izmir where 1pi of 1881 issue affixed and tied by boxed hand stamp, transit to Istanbul 9th of August and finally arrived London on 14th of August.

FORGERIES

There are two major forgeries of the basic stamp and numerous forgeries of the hand stamped or overprinted issues. Only the basic stamp forgeries shown in this collection. The most important forgery is the *Sperati* and rather cruel is *Fournier*

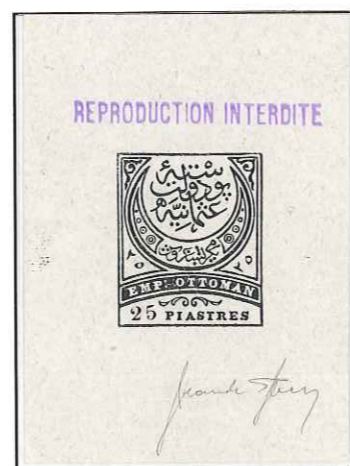
