



DEC. 6, 1843: DRY HARBOUR (FOSTER TYPE P26 - LESS THAN 150 KNOWN TO EXIST) TO LONDON. INLAND POSTAGE OF 6p paid as indicated by (<100 miles) "ppd 6" in ^{black} manuscript. Note: Dry Harbour was the first landfall of Columbus. Spanish name was Palo or Puerto Seco. The scarce cancellation was in use between July 17, 39 to Feb 28, 1851. Note: When the letter reached London via British Packet, paid marking was crossed out and manuscript "It was added for collection of one shilling from the received."
