Nguyen Council Okays Resignation

SAIGON (UPI)—South Vietnam's civilian High National Council has accepted Premier Nguyen's resignation, a Government spokesman disclosed Wednesday night.

The spokesman said the 17-member council, which has the job of guiding this embattled nation to civilian, democratic rule, accepted Nguyen's resignation along with those of a council meeting Tuesday evening.

The official announcement of Nguyen's resignation, and the name of his successor, were not expected until Friday when the council has called a news conference.

Meanwhile, authoritative Vietnamese sources said the four generals who engineered the overthrow of themselves and Nguyen in his Jan. 30 coup, have been re-thrown by the armed forces. Major Gen. Nguyen

Ikeda Illness Looming As Big Issue Next Week

Whether ailing Prime Minister Hayato Ikeda will recover enough to attend the forthcoming extraordinary Diet session will loom as a major political question for the nation's politicians next week.

Political attention is now being riveted on a medical bulletin to be announced Sunday by the National Cancer Center on Ikeda's recuperation prospects.

Based on the outcome of the center's over-all checkup of Ikeda now under way, both the Socialists and the Democratic Socialists are expected to map out their respective action programs dealing with various domestic political questions and particularly their Diet policies.

Indications are that both major Opposition parties will prod the Government to convene Ikeda's presence at the extra session.

The Liberal-Democratic Party, meanwhile, still sticks to its original stand calling for an acting Prime Minister in case Ikeda cannot recover in time for the Diet session late in November.

It is feared that the unavailability of the Prime Minister as chief expositor and administrator of the Government's post-war policies would provoke a serious opposition protest.

The National Cancer Center reported that the ailing premier's condition is not yet stable.

Rice Price Hike Inevitable: Ikeda

Prime Minister Hayato Ikeda said Thursday that the proposed increase in rice retail price would be "inevitable."

This was revealed after Chief Cabinet Secretary Zenko Suzuki and Mamoru Takahashi, director of the Economic Planning Agency met Ikeda at the National Cancer Center, Tsukiji.

The Government earlier approved a 13.6 per cent boost in the producers' price of rice.

A retail price boost up to 20 per cent reportedly is being discussed within the Government.

Sartre Wins Nobel Prize In Literature

PARIS (Kyodo-Reuters)—Jean-Paul Sartre has refused the Nobel Literature Prize awarded him Thursday, Mme. Germaine Sarbets, of Sartre's magazine Les Temps Modernes, told Reuters Thursday.

In a statement, which she said Sartre had authorized, Mme. Sarbets said: "He will receive two Swedish journal-ists this afternoon for explaining his reasons for refusing the award so that they can inform the Swedish Academy (which awarded the prize)."

STOCKHOLM (UPI)—French author-philosopher Jean-Paul Sartre Thursday won the 1964 Nobel Prize for Literature.

The 59-year-old author was awarded the honor, which includes a \$2,500 tax-free prize, despite the decline of the award.

The newspaper reports he awarded the honor to Sartre because of his "imaginative and originality."
