

## Liberia

UPU member from 1 April 1879.

The 1879 Liberty design 1 to 24 cents new colours and denominations were circulated on 30 December 1880 cancelled with six heavy parallel bars each 12 mm long and 1½ mm thick, the contemporary postmark 'killer'.

The 1881 3 cents was distributed with the same International Bureau circular and it was stated that 'the 3 cent is destined exclusively to correspondence circulated within the interior of the Republic of Liberia'. This stamp and all later issues except for those shown were in normal unused condition.

Stamps overprinted with types [1], [2] and [3] were printed by Waterlow. The style of overprint is typical of that found on other stamps printed by Waterlow and it may be supposed that the overprints were applied by them.

Type P2 is known on other stamps printed by Perkins, Bacon.

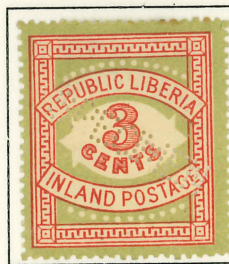

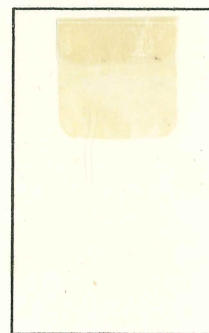
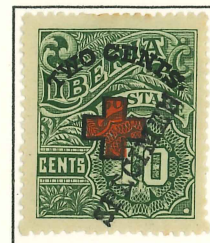
