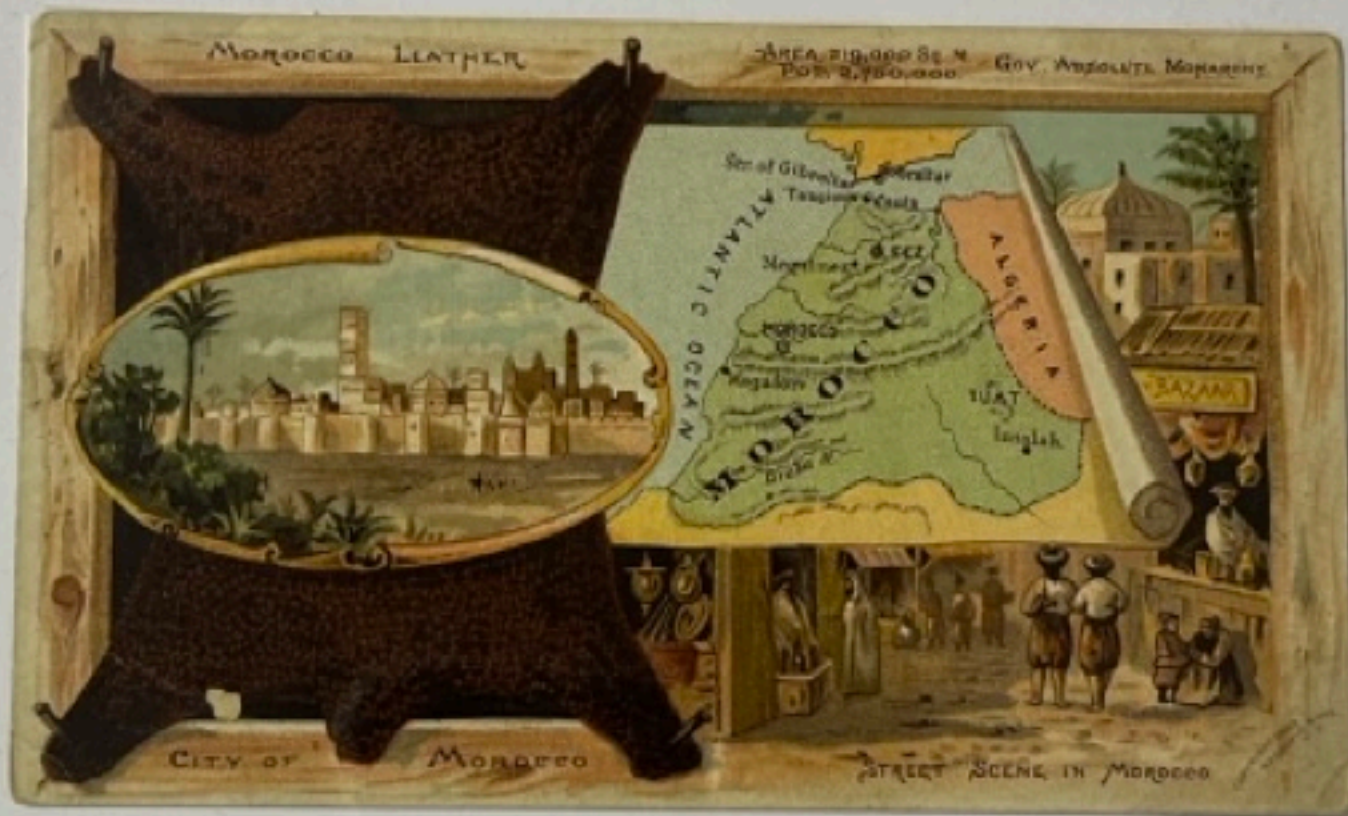

The Gibel Sarsar was withdrawn from service in 1923 and scrapped in 1926.

Civilised and steep, it runs from the Bab-el-Mansour (Marine Gate) to the Bab-el-Sâk (Market Gate). Tangier is, practically, the only "civilised" corner of Morocco, in the sense that it contains hotels, shops, and streets bearing some resemblance to those of European towns. Travelers will note the resemblance of the street above shown to the Grand Rue de Pera in Constantinople. In both cases, the narrow thoroughfare, containing small French-owned shops and Italian-looking white houses with balconies, is crowded with people clad in every conceivable kind of costume, suggestive of the extremes of civilization.

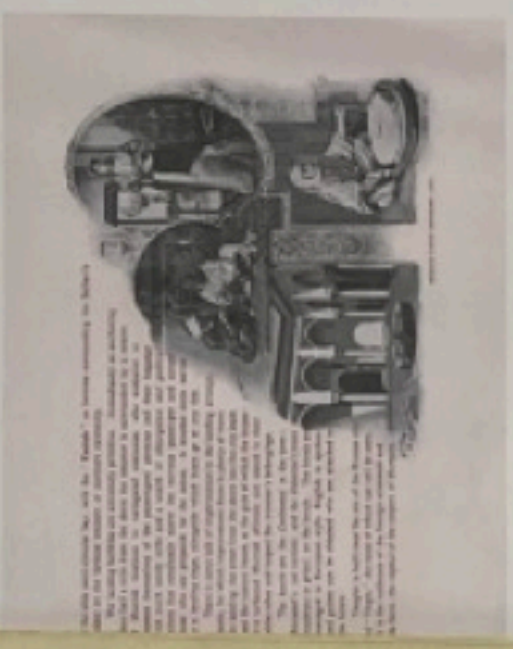

NDL was founded in 1857 and by 1907 had regular transatlantic sailings from Bremerhaven to both North & South America.  
Its regular Mediterranean route was Marseilles to Alexandria.  
From this brochure produced for the North American market, and in this case, distributed by "Akers & Folkman", Ocean Steamship Agents, of Cleveland Ohio they were obviously providing leisure cruises in Spanish and Moroccan waters

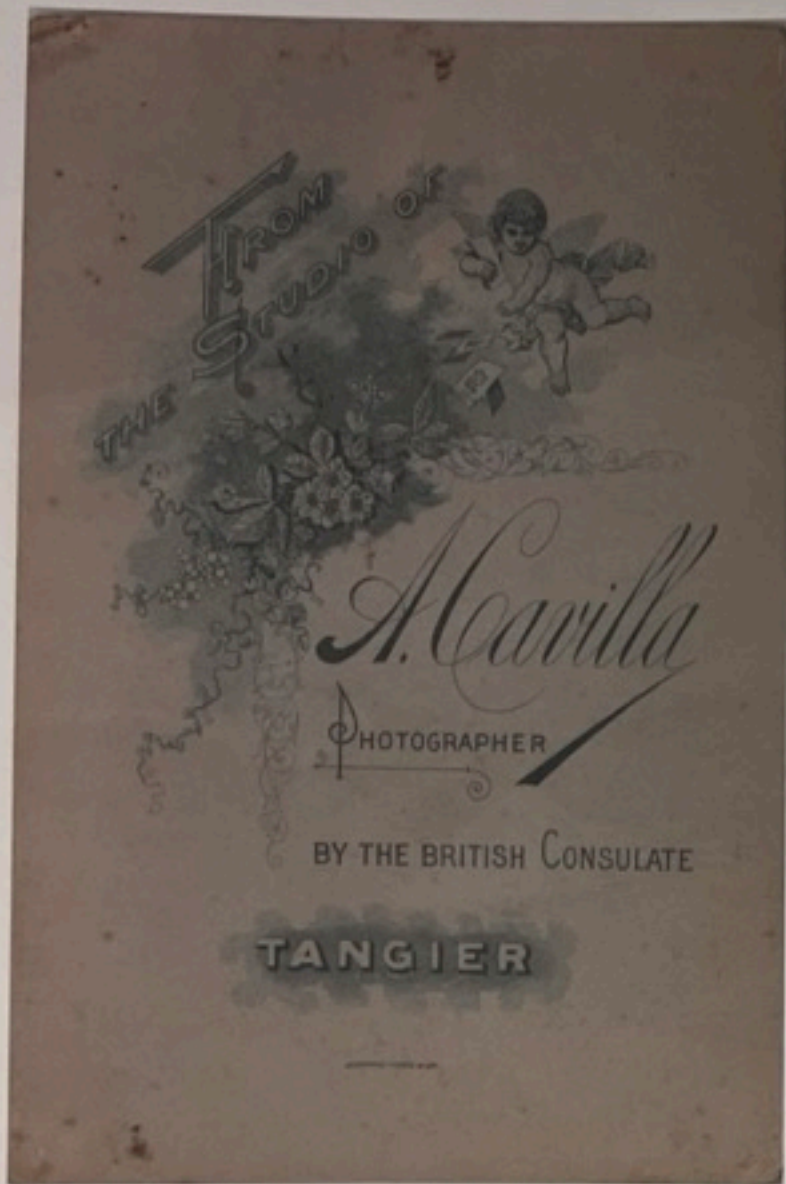
DISEMBARKING GERMAN PRISONERS AT CASABLANCA



In Morocco, as elsewhere, German captives are treated with humanity and in an honourable manner, but the German authorities—probably to divert attention from their own abominable treatment of prisoners of war—declared that the German prisoners in Africa were being badly treated, and by way of reprisals set French prisoners to the work of draining marshy and unhealthy regions. It was not until the French threatened reprisals on their part that the German authorities climbed down.

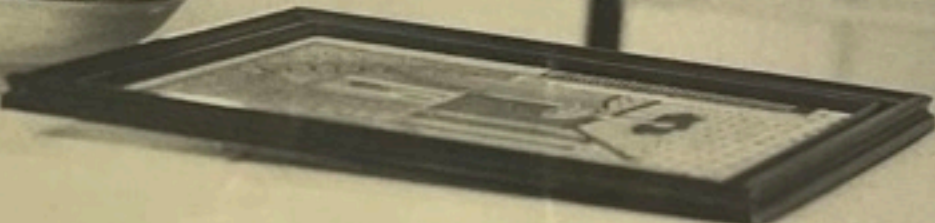

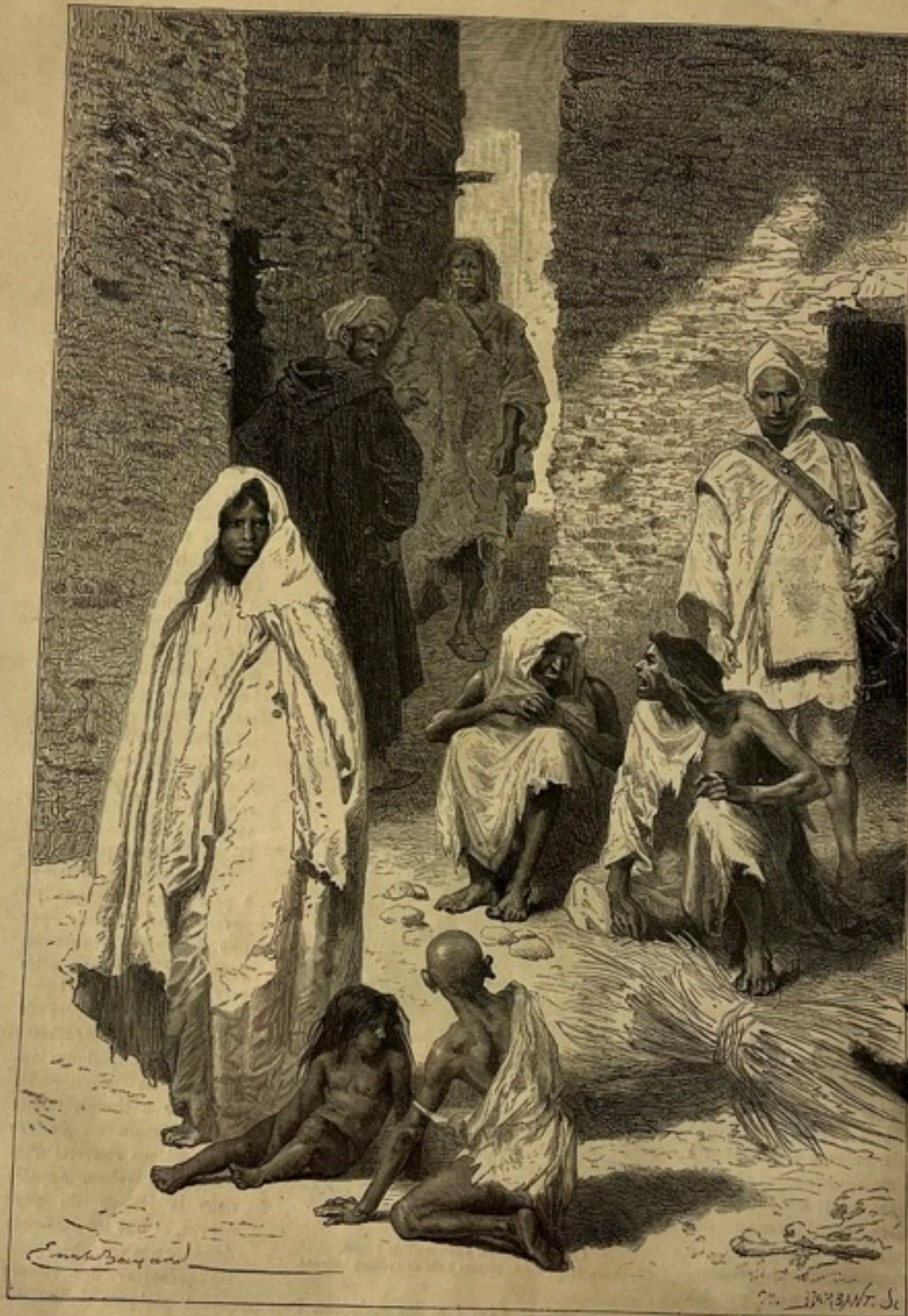
