Young woman (Eire) with right hand resting on harp, having just written first words of new constitution "In Ainm na Tríonóide Ro-Naomhtha" in which the supreme dominion of the Almighty is acknowledged, divine assistance invoked and Ireland's destiny committed to His care.

1938 100 ANNV. TEMPERANCE CRUSADE



Theobald Mathew (1790-1856), temperance reformer, member of Capuchin order. His influence, great in Ireland, spread to England and the United States.




Washington, eagle bearing shield of the original thirteen states and Irish harp.

50 YEARS OF GAELIC LEAGUE



Dr. Douglas Hyde (1860-1949), president of Eire 1938-45, scholar and writer. Also the first president of the Gaelic League which encouraged the preservation and extension of the Celtic (Irish) language.

THEORY OF QUATERNIONS



Sir William Rowan Hamilton (1805-65), mathematician and physicist, made important contributions in dynamics and quantum theory. Discovery of quaternions was first disclosed in paper he read to Royal Irish Society November 13, 1843.

1944 300th ANNIV. DEATH OF O'CLERY



Michael O'Clery (1574-1643), a Franciscan lay brother, one of four historians who compiled "Annals of Four Masters," a history of Ireland from earliest times to opening of the 17th Century. The words "Do cum Gloire De agus Onora na Eireann" (For the Glory of God and the Honor of Ireland) are from preamble to Annals.

1944 EDMOND I. RICE



Issued to commemorate 100th anniversary of death of Brother Edmond Ignatius Rice (1762-1844), founder of Christian Brothers of Ireland. He was superior general of order 1822-38.

1945 THOMAS O. DAVIS



Member of "Young Irelanders" sowing seeds of freedom. Organization founded by Thomas Osborne Davis (1814-45), poet and politician. Stamps commemorate 100th anniversary of his death.

1949 J. C. MANGAN

James Clarence Mangan (1803-49), one of Ireland's great poets. Author of *My Dark Rosaleen* and *The Nameless One*. Stamp commemorates 100th anniversary of his death.

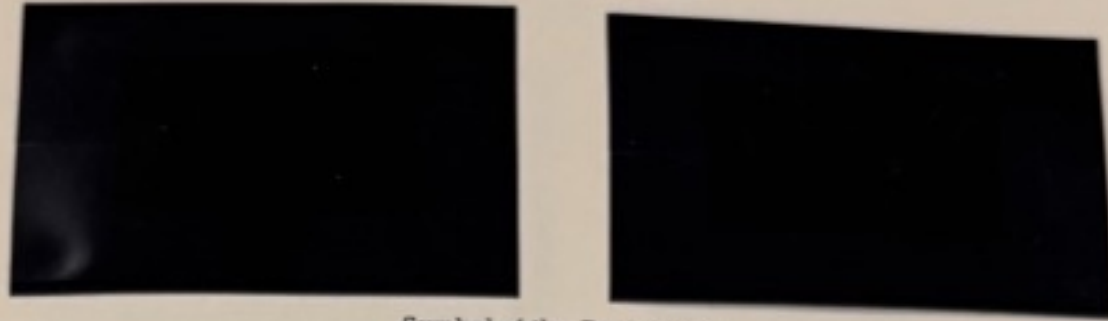

Designed by Arne Helm of Norway, the intertwining squares were chosen as the official EUROPA design at the meeting of the Conference of European Post and Telecommunication Administrations of January 22 in Bonn, West Germany.

Two stamps issued December 2 depict the centenary emblem.

1964 - WOLFE TONE



These stamps commemorate the 200th anniversary of the birth of Theobald Wolfe Tone, freedom fighter.



1964 - NEW YORK WORLD'S FAIR



Two stamp issued July 20th depict the Irish Pavilion at the 646 acre fair ground in Flushing Meadow, New York.

1965 — WILLIAM BUTLER YEATS



One of Ireland's foremost literary figures, Yeats produced nearly 20 volumes of poetry for which he won the Nobel Prize in 1923. He helped establish the Irish Literary Theater (now, the famous Abby Players) and wrote and directed for them until his death in 1939. Stamps commemorate 100th anniversary of his birth.

1965 — INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION YEAR



International Cooperation Year was also the 20th anniversary of the United Nations. The clasped hands was the official symbol chosen by the I.C.Y. committee.

This set of stamps commemorates 50th Anniversary of the Easter Uprising and pays tribute to the signatories of the Proclamation of the Irish Republic, executed after the Rising.



1966. ROGER CASEMENT



The 50th anniversary of the death of the Irish patriot, Roger Casement, was commemorated by this set of two stamps. Casement, who was knighted in 1911 for his services to the British Government and acclaimed for his humanitarian work in exposing ill-treatment of the native workers in the rubber plantations of the Upper Congo and in the Putumayo, was executed in London on August 3, 1916 on a charge of high treason resulting from his part in the events leading up to the Rising of that year.

1966. 750 YEARS OF BALLINTUBBER ABBEY



Interior of the Abbey

The famous abbey was founded by Cathal O'Connor, King of Connaught in 1216 near a church founded by St. Patrick and near a well used by the saint to baptize converts. The abbey, an example of the transition from Romanesque to Gothic style, has been in continuous use for divine worship in spite of partial destruction during Cromwellian wars.

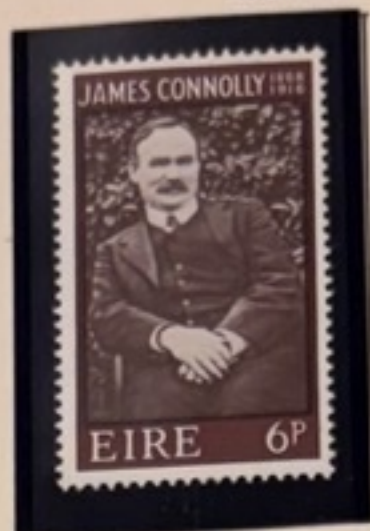

COUNTESS MARKIEVICZ



Countess Constance Markievicz (1868-1927) born in London as eldest child of Henry Gore-Booth, married Count Casimir Dunin-Markievicz in 1900, fought in 1916 as an officer of the Citizen Army. Death sentence for her part in the Risings was commuted. She served as first Minister for Labor in Irish Free State.



1968. 100th ANNIV. BIRTH OF
JAMES CONNOLLY



James Connolly (1868-1916) born in Edinburg, founded the Irish Socialist Republican Party and edited its organ, the "Workers' Republic." Commanded Irish Citizen Army which joined forces with Irish Volunteers in the Rising of 1916 to proclaim the Irish Republic. He was executed on May 12, 1916.

1969. 50th ANNIV. OF FIRST DAIL EIREANN



First meeting of Dail Eireann at Mansion House, Dublin, Jan. 21, 1919.

Sinn Fein members, elected to the British Parliament at General Election of 1918, met, issued a declaration confirming the Republic proclaimed in 1916 and constituted themselves the National Parliament (Dail Eireann).

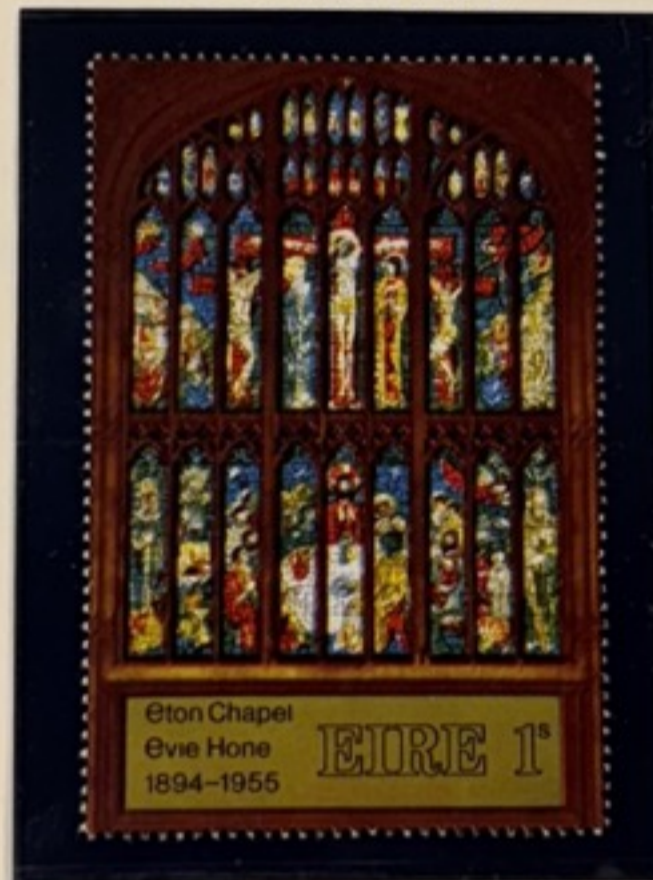

Tomás MacCurtain, commander of 1st Cork Brigade of IRA (1918), Lord Mayor of Cork (1920), murdered in his home by members of Royal Irish Constabulary.

Terence MacSwiney, author of *Principles of Freedom*, member of First Dail, succeeded MacCurtain as Lord Mayor of Cork, died in prison after 75 days of hunger strike.



Born into a nationalist family Kevin Barry joined the Irish Volunteers in his early teens. Captured following a clash with British forces in the streets of Dublin in September 1920 he was tried by court martial, sentenced to death by hanging and was hanged in Mountjoy Jail on 1st November 1920. He was then only eighteen years old.

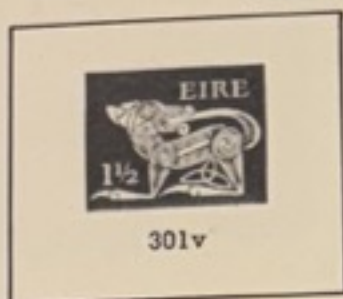

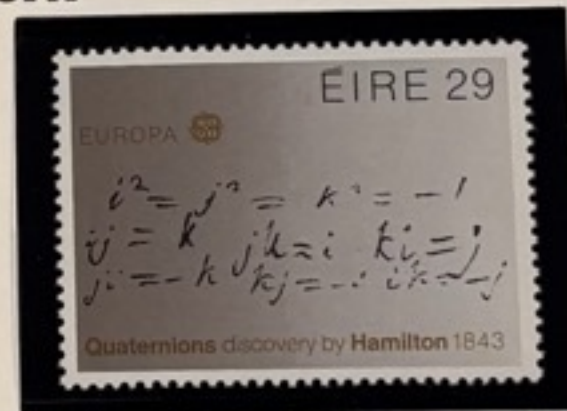
