As printing proceeded there was a partial thickening of the normal five wavy lines ending up with two thick lines and in some printings a single thick line: all due to plate wear.

Issued 27 July 1934

The single 2^d stamp was issued to celebrate the golden jubilee of the Gaelic Athletic Association (G.A.A.) which was founded in Hayes Hotel, Thurles, Co. Tipperary on 1st November 1884. The first patrons were Charles Stewart Parnell, Michael Davitt and Archbishop Stokes, after whom the famous park was named.

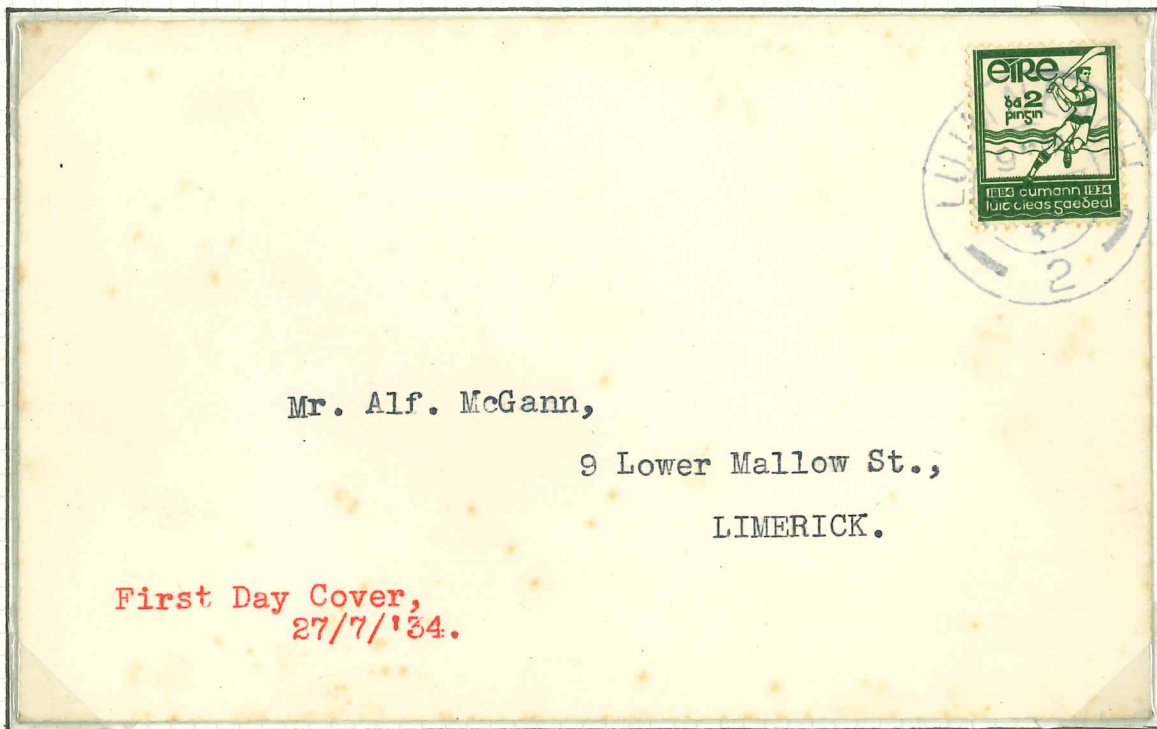
The design depicting a hurler in action was by R. J. King. The inscription in panel reads, "Gaelic Athletic Association".

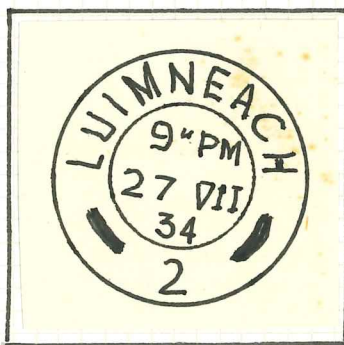
