

Two entire letters from Homer Frazer, father of William Frazer. Addressed to William in India and referring to James Frazer, his other son who left India to travel overland to the U.K. and when last heard of was in Odessa, on the Black Sear.

The first letter is dated 24th December 1822 was posted in "St Omer, France" addressed to W. Frazer, Civil Service of the Honble. E.I. Co., Bengal, readdressed to Delhi. On the reverse is the French handstamp with the date 27 DE. Also on the reverse is the Calcutta stamp (Inld Ptg 14As- Ship Do 2As- 1Rs.) HG SR9 in use 1821-37. On the front is shown the date of arrival, 14th May 1823.

The second letter is dated New Years Day 1822. Posted again in St. Omer. There is again a French transit stamp with the date "JA12 1822" The address is "Assistant to the Resident Delhi" On the reverse is the Calcutta stamp "G.P.O.—with segments SEPD 19- PtPd (HG 15, in use fr. The transit to Calcutta 8 Months
