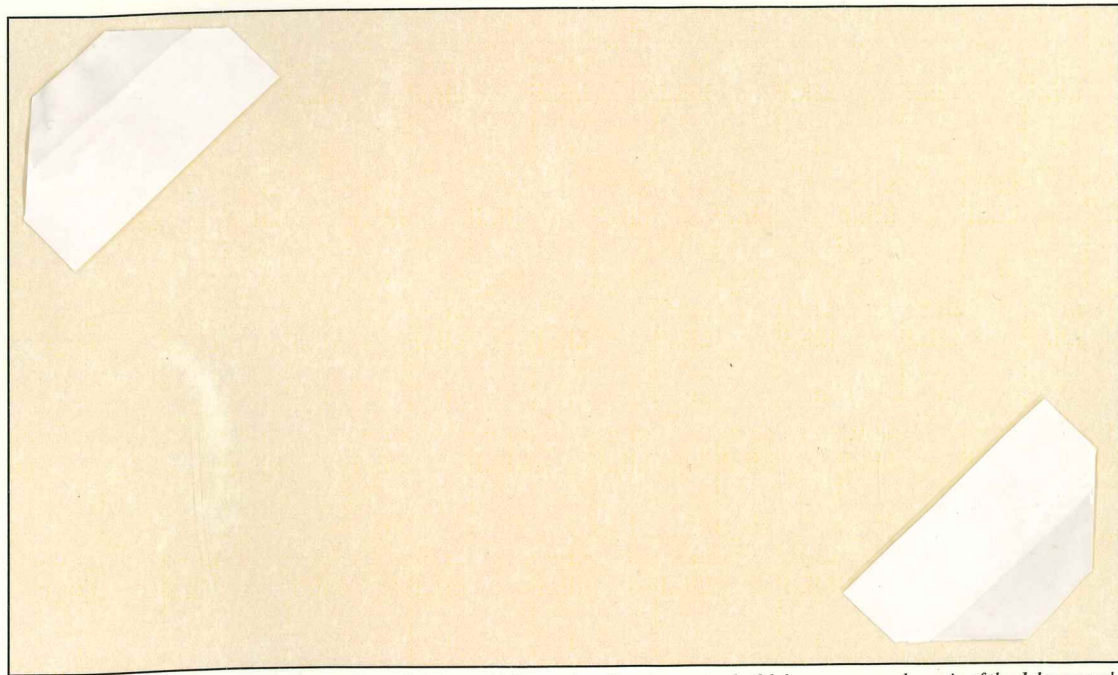

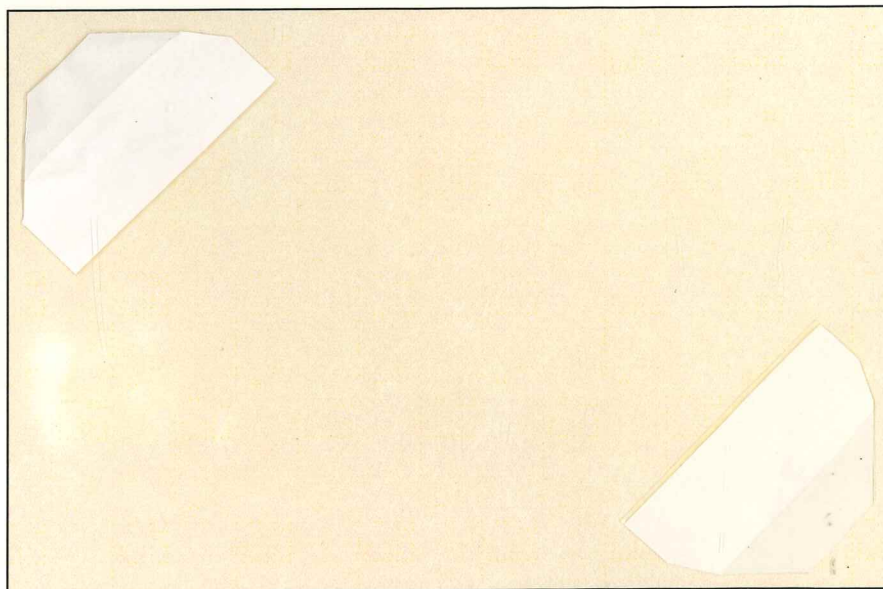

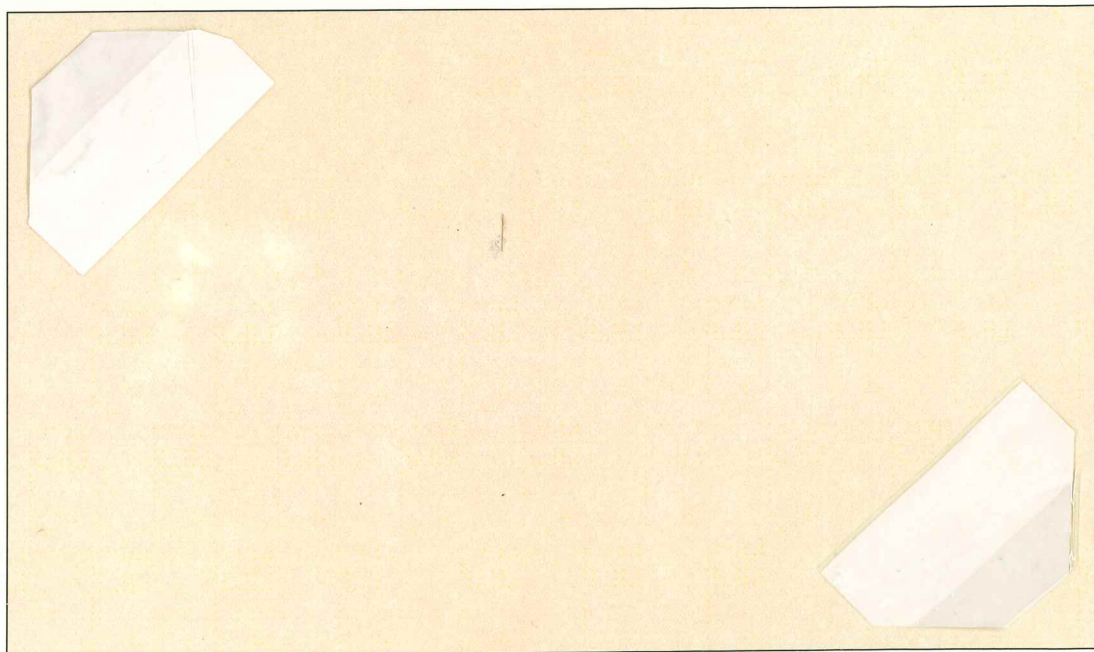

St Vincent authorities complained of the quality of the paper and the poor gumming. From this issue the paper became watermarked 'Small Stars', supposed to be of a better quality, where the intended position of a single star was at the centre of each stamp. When the paper sheet was printed, the star should have a point upward (Upright). If the sheet was turned 90 degrees the star appears with two points upward; in this case the watermark is called 'Sideways'. Both the 1d and the 6d stamps were printed, at first, on thin paper of good quality. Later on the paper became more thick, in some cases almost 'card'. These two stamps were ordered on 6 January 1871, printed in February, invoiced on 28 March, and finally delivered in the island on 21 April. Both the 1d and the 6d are found with all the three perforations varieties, with watermark sideways or upright. Shades of the penny stamp are not marked, the 6d showing, on the contrary, at least four significant shades.

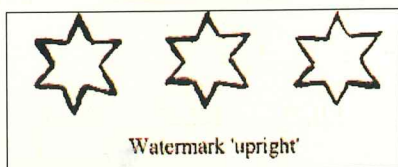

The last shipment of 1878, concerning 1.000 sheets of the 1 penny black, in May 1880, was exhausted. The new consignment being late, the first 'Provisional' of St Vincent was prepared. This was done by overprinting 900 6d stamps of a deep blue green shade, probably from the last printing of 1875. The stamps were done by overprinting a large figure 1 in red, then divided by a central line of clean-cut perforation gauging 12, obtaining 1.800 one penny stamps. All these operations were done by a printer in Kingstown.

1/2d stamps had to be issued because St Vincent joined UPU on 1 September 1881. Regular stamps were invoice on 16 November, and reached the island in early December. These provisionals were done by overprinting twice the value on each 6d stamp (SG 30), then divided by a central line of clean-cut perforation gauging 12, obtaining 1.440 half penny stamps. All these operations were done by a printer in Kingstown.

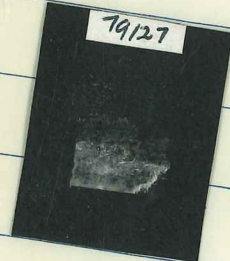

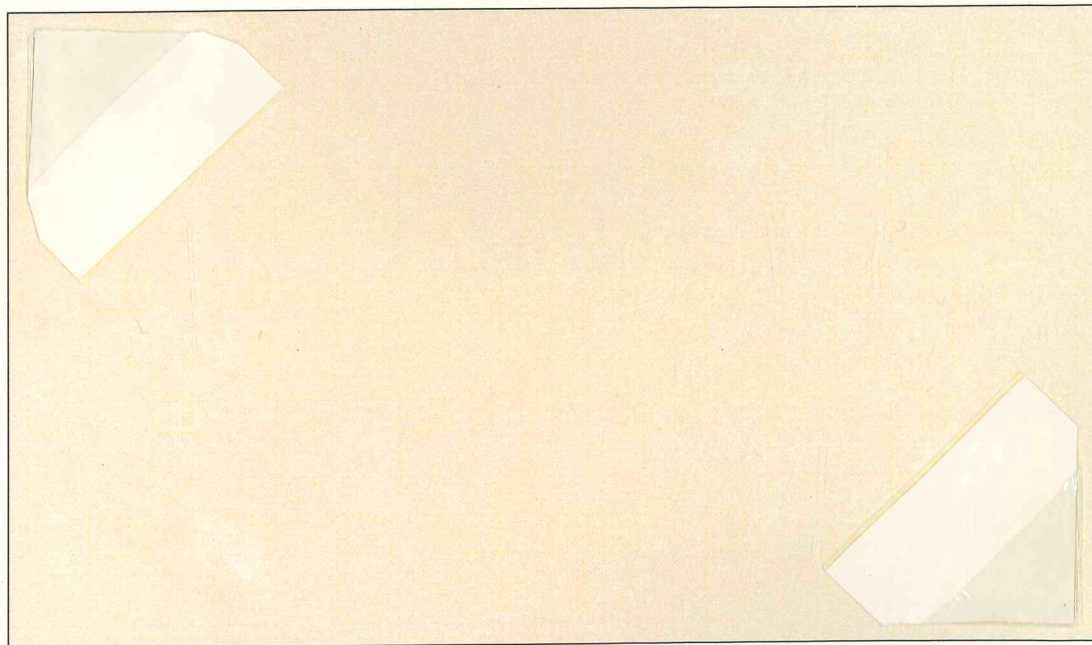

Many times there have been complaints to Perkins & Bacon because the colour of their stamps were not to be compared to the De La Rue surfaced printed stamps. Finally in January 1882 the contract was cancelled and the plates handled to the new printer. Surprisingly, De La Rue do not adopted their method, i.e. surface typographic printing, but for another eighteen years they used the old steel plates.
