1933 Setting IV cliches 6/4 1 Tranka reddish orange and shiny shade not recorded by waterfall. But many orange shades existed. Nepal 52 tied to cover c̄ illegible cancel; Reverse has receiving mark also poorly legible.

This cover may have been manufactured as the envelope flap still has original gum. Also the original Tibetan stamps are not tied to the cover with the Type VIII cancellation. The stamps are on the front instead of the back as most other covers. Interesting Forgery with authentic Tibetan stamps and cancellation.

During this time period the registered letters were 4-5 Tr cancel obscurs denomination on stamps. The 2 Tr stamps were of a similar color making it relatively easy for postal fraud to occur during this time.

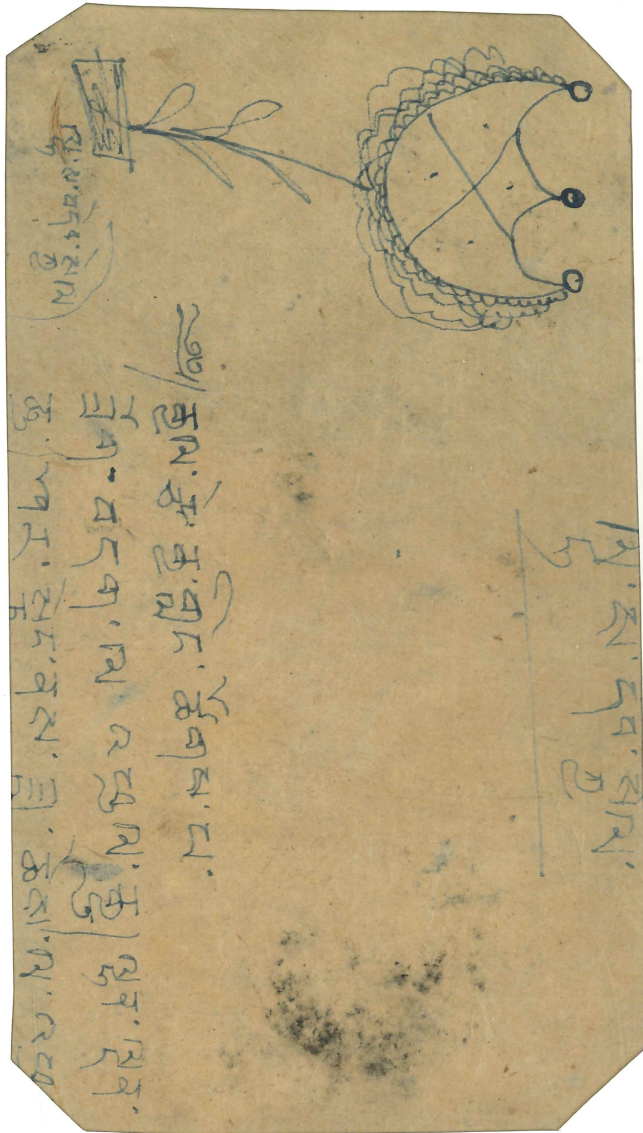
