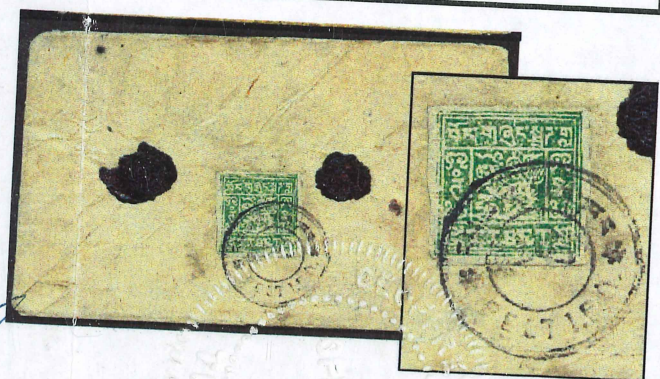

Two intact Wax Seals. Dated "Sept. 24" - no year, circa early 1950s. VF Condition.

JAMMU AND KASHMIR, 1866-1867.

I have examined the complete native envelope posted at Jammu, franked with one postage stamp issued under the authority of the Maharaja of Jammu and Kashmir, "Dogra Sun in circle" 1/2 anna grey black, printed in watercolour, imperforate, on greyish native laid paper without watermark, Stanley Gibbons #1, Scott Catalogue #1, cancelled by the magenta seal, a colour reproduction of which is on the reverse side of this certificate, in true size, and am of the opinion that:

The envelope, postage stamp affixed and postal marking are **genuine in all respects**. The envelope is in excellent state of preservation; the stamp is cut square and in good condition. The 1/2 anna stamp prepaid the postage for an internally addressed letter with weight not exceeding 1/4 tola (about 1/10 of one ounce). I have signed the envelope.

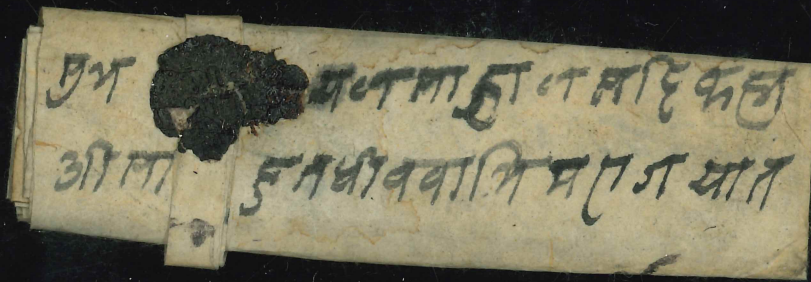

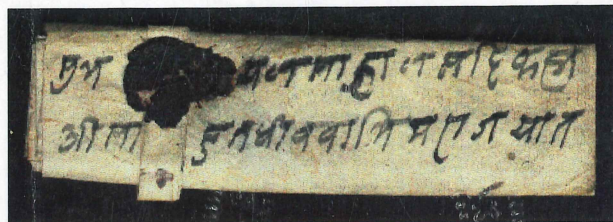


GEOFFREY FLACK TIBETAN STAMPS AND POSTAL HISTORY OPINION
