# NO CORNER LETTERS AND IMPRIMATURS

The January 1841 2d Blue is significant in the history of Philately . The first stamp deliberately altered, no Corner Letters.  
Imprimatur stamps were from the first sheet of a new issue to be Registered at Somerset House.

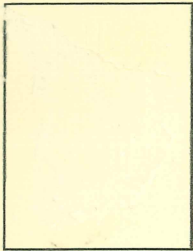
# SPECIMEN TYPES 2 AND 5.
