Only an auction catalogue can do justice to the magnificence and scope of this group of the Caspary Classics.

The 1847 issue is particularly outstanding. Of the 5c unused there are seven singles and several multiples. Used include off cover 49 singles, 17 pairs and a block of four; on cover 24 singles, 11 doubles or pairs.

Of the 10c unused there are seven singles and three pairs; used off cover 13 singles, 4 pairs and a marginal strip of five; on cover 23 singles, one double, one quadruple and a wonderful strip of four. Many items are marginal and a number of covers originate from Canada. The issue concludes with four 10c bisects on covers.

The 1851-57 issue, some 450 items, truly shows Mr. Caspary's love of fine pieces. Wonderful marginal pieces, pairs, strips, blocks, covers, postmarks exist in profusion. Typical of the scope is the imperf. 5c which is represented by 5 unused singles and a pair. Off cover, 16 used singles, three pairs and three strips of three.

The "on cover" group contains 8 singles, one with 3c and 10c, three pairs (two marginal), a strip of three, two pairs on one cover, pair and two singles on another.

There is a similar range of the 10c and 12c, and of the 1857-61 issue, the latter including such items as blocks of 21 and 9 of the 90c.

The auction will conclude with two sets of the 1875 reprints of the 1857-60 issue.

UNITED STATES POSTMASTERS' PROVISIONALS

Unique item after unique item! A truly fabulous representation of these great forerunners of the United States Federal issues. Alexandria is represented by four copies, type I on buff, type II on buff (2) and type I on blue.

Annapolis includes the "5 Paid" frank and three impressions of the seal. The Baltimore "Buchanans" are a wonderful group including six covers with the 5c on white, one with vertical pair, two covers with the 10c on white and the unique 10c on bluish, representing a catalogue price of \$47,400 with one cover unpriced. This group is followed by nine examples of the Buchanan envelopes, including two 10c.

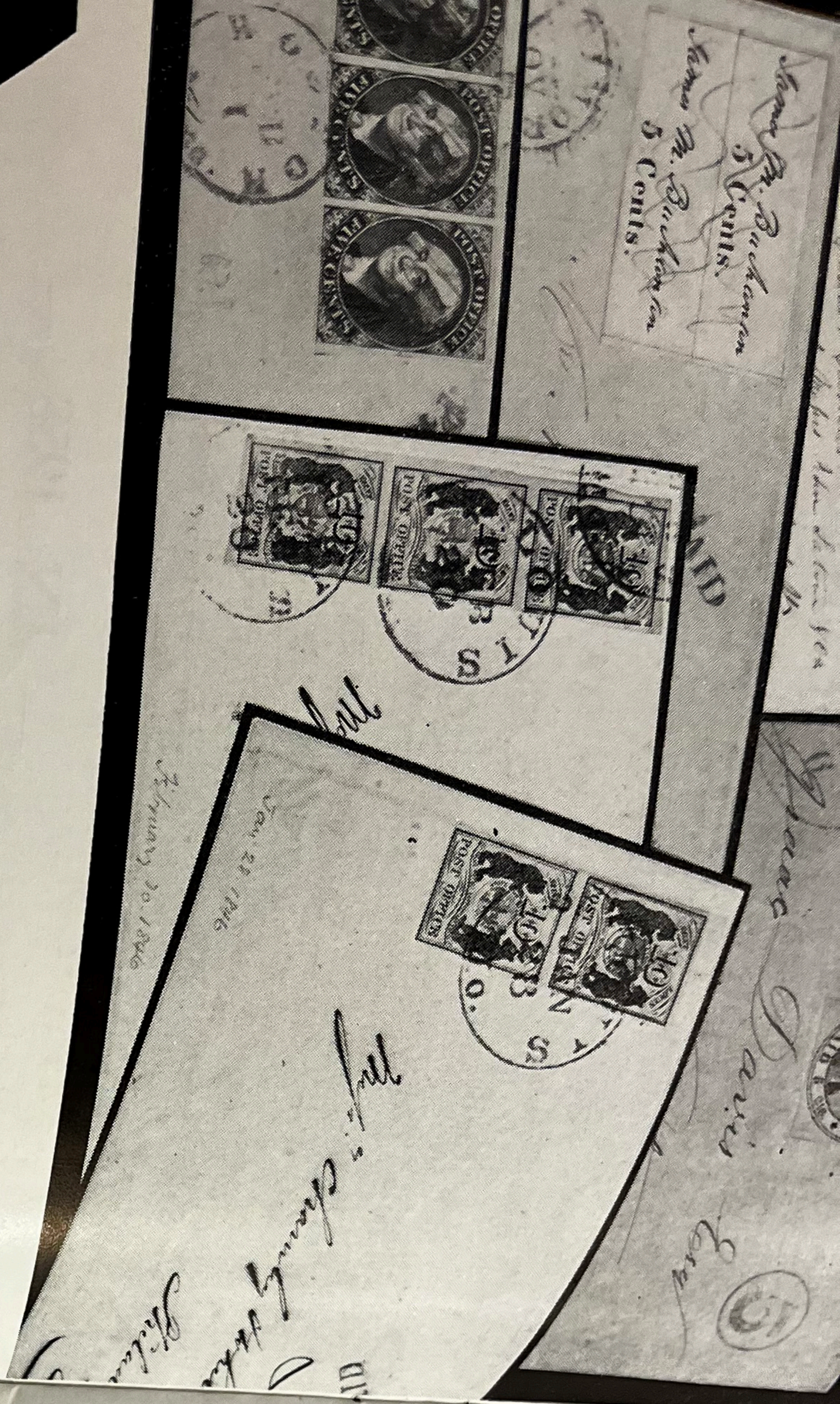
The Brattleboro is shown on five covers and a piece, one cover bearing two copies.

The Lockport 5c on cover being the only known copy, cataloguing \$6,000, also the finest existing Millbury 5c cataloguing the same. Two examples of the New Haven 5c covers follow, also one copy cut square.

The New York 5c is an extraordinary group, 19 singles, 11 pairs off cover, 15 singles on covers (several used outside of New York), 5 pairs on 4 covers (one from Boston), and a strip of three on large piece from Boston.

Providence is another excellent section, including severed pair of 5c and eight singles on covers. The St. Louis Bears comprise 25 items and a reconstructed sheet of the second state on gray liac. Multiples, marginal copies, covers all are included.

A great opening sale of a great collection.
